

January 2020 Speaker Review

Dale W. Miller, of the Golden Gate Electric Vehicle Association (GGEVA), gave the luncheon talk to the Branch 47 membership on January 28, 2020. GGEVA is the local chapter of the Electric Vehicle Association, a non-profit organization that promotes the use of electric vehicles.

Mr. Miller talked about the many advantages of electric vehicles. In addition to the environmental benefits of not using fossil fuels, electric vehicles have a number of other advantages over conventional vehicles. These advantages include excellent acceleration, low cost per mile (\$0.04/ mile for electric vs. \$0.16/mile for gas), lower maintenance costs, and simpler mechanical systems. He said that newer cars are engineered to run 1,000,000 miles. Battery lifetimes are now in excess of 8 years.

He addressed the perception that electric vehicles are expensive. The lowest cost electric vehicle on the market is now \$31600, and there are a number of government rebate programs available. He cited a study that showed the 5-year ownership costs were actually lower for a Tesla Model 3 than a Camry.

Another perception is that the range of electric vehicles is limited. Cars with ranges up to 373 miles are available, and more than 8 models have range in excess of 226 miles. This is compared to the typical California commute of 40 miles. Charging times can become an issue on longer trips, but the situation is improving. A 240-volt system needs 2 ½ hours to provide 100 miles of charge, although new DC Fast Charge systems can do the job in ½ hour. Tesla has 15,911 connections at 1804 locations in North America.

There was a spirited question and answer session. Some of the questions were:

What about hybrids? Mr. Miller believes they are on the way out.

What are Toyota's plans?

Toyota apparently is focusing on hydrogen fuel, although the company has recently announced an electric vehicle.

How do you reconcile the future of electric vehicles with the views of the current administration? The visions are not reconcilable.

What is the cost of a charging station? The cheapest is around \$500, but there may be additional costs associated with installation.
