Treasurer's Report:

A table was set up at the February meeting to facilitate payment of membership dues. Reminders were sent out by e-mail to membership to bring checks to the next luncheon in the amount of \$33.00 for luncheon fee and \$30.00 for dues for 2022.

Membership Report:

Our curent branch membership is 96. Members and guests scheduled for the February meeting is 53. Branch 47 has 150 rosters for distribution. Printed rosters are being prepared for paid dues members. Printed rosters for 2022 can also be picked up by paid up-dues members.

Lunchon Checklist:

As a matter of principle, the most ideal situation would be to have the event be self-supporting. The matter will be revisited as we approach the fall season.

The next Board meeting will take place on March 22, 2022, 10:30 am. with Zoom transmission.

The February meeting was moved for adjournment at 12:05 p.m.


