I volunteered at the US Open which was held at the LACC (Los Angeles Country Club) from June 11th through the 18th . I had a great time. When I was growing up, I often accompanied my dad to the Bing Crosby Clam Bake at Pebble Beach later called the AT&T. My family is a golfing family. The winner was Wyndham Clark. He is the first Colorado native to win the US Open. It was his first major championship, and he joined an elite group of professional golfers. His caddy, John Ellis, says that "The ability and the skillset that he has was always there to be a top-ten player in the world, but he was way too hard on himself, and his expectations were too high. [before] He didn't allow himself to unlock what he was. He sort of played tight and fearful of what the next shot might be, good or bad." (Quote from the Denver Post) The US Open is one of four major golf championships held annually: The Masters, The PGA Championship [recently held at Harding Park in 2020], The USOPEN and The Open which is held in the UK.

As volunteers, we had credentials. We could attend the golf tournament all week long. We also had our own volunteer center with coffee, snacks, sodas, water, and fruit available. On the days we were scheduled to "work", we were given lunch tickets for our food. The volunteer center had large screens showing the tournament, so we did not miss anything.

<u>Speaker Name</u>: Kym McNicholas is an Emmy Award-Winning journalist with nearly 20 years experiencing covering all aspects of innovation from technology and sports, to healthcare, and entertainment. She's nationally recognized through her weekly appearances on Fox News Channel's, Forbes On Fox show and most recently on TLC's "Suddenly Rich"

Kym kicked off her career helping to revolutionize the world of online video journalism as a pioneer of digital video content during the <u>dot.com</u> boom and beyond. Her tenure at Forbes solidified her beat in business and has developed her into an extremely well connected industry expert, interviewing luminaries such as Virgin's Sir Richard Branson, Tesla's Elon Musk, Oracle's Sandra Katz, and more.

Kym's experience in tech and innovation led her to run the world's largest and most prestigious global startup competition, the "Extreme Tech Challenge", with Sir Richard Branson as the anchor judge. During her 3 years as Executive Director, she vetted more than 4K startups. That's when she discovered the wave of innovation in healthcare and launched a radio show, "Kym McNicholas on Innovation." It was in that show that she met physicians who informed her of the next big pandemic, Peripheral Artery Disease (PAD), plaque build-up in mainly the leg arteries, which is one of the leading indicators of risk for heart attack, stroke, and amputation.

Kym traveled the world over the last six years to ten countries and more than two dozen States to learn more about PAD and report on, as a journalist, diagnostic and treatment options. During that journey, Kym observed thousands of hours of procedures in which Vascular Specialists used multiple methods to unblock arteries in legs and heart, interviewed hundreds of doctors and patients, and met with dozens of medical device-makers, as well as hospital and Office-Based Lab/Ambulatory Surgery Center administrators. She is now using that knowledge as founder and CEO of high-touch advocacy non-profit The Way to My Heart, a 501(c)(3). She has so far saved the limbs of more than 500 patients told that amputation was the only option. Her goal is to save the more than 200,000 patients getting needless amputation annually.

Kym is also the daughter of our own Bill McNicholas.

2023 Garden Bocce Party June 13th




This day would start out with cloud cover and no sun which was very unusual for a


