NO SHOW POLICY

Sorry it had to come to this, but it is irresponsible to make a reservation and then have your fellow members pay for a lunch that you did not pay for.

Speaker Name: Michael D. Blodget, PHD

Michael is an historian for the 349th Air Mobility Wing at Travis Air Force Base. He received his BA in Political Science from the University of California, Los Angeles. He then went to graduate school at California State University Santa Barbara where he studied history. He received his Ph. D. in History in June of 2007. He then taught history at California State University Channel Islands.

He studied Communism and American diplomatic and military history with a focus on the Cold War and taught these subjects at CSUCI. Additionally, he has a keen interest in global radicalism and terrorism and has developed classes on these subjects for CSUCI.

The topic of the speech will be Iran and the United States: The Roots of Confrontation. He will look at the Iranian American relationship, which was so strong in the 1970's, and examine how that relationship ended and why it has led to confrontation today.
