Speaking of disasters. The State governing body of SIR held a Town Hall Zoom meeting on June 26th to announce several changes that they wish to put in effect for the entire SIR organization. The reason stated for these changes is the continued decline of membership in the SIR organization. They are proposing to:

- 1. Change the name of the Organization
- 2. Change the Big and Little Sir to President and Vice-President
- 3. Change the Mission Statement and Logo
- 4. Rename Branches as "Chapters"
- 5. Eliminate the word "Retirement" from the organization
- 6. Change the By-Laws to include gender neutrality
- 7. Reorganize as a non-profit under the provisions of Internal Revenue Code §501(c)(3)

August Speaker: August Topic: How to run a local government for fun and profit!

Ted Gaebler has been a member of SIRS branch 47 for three years. He is an internationally recognized authority on new approaches to government management and he has been changing governments for more than 50 years.

Mr. Gaebler is the co-author of the best-selling book "Reinventing Government," which explores transforming governments from outdated, bureaucratic organizations, to flexible, customer-focused organizations. Ted's book was translated into 23 languages and has sold more copies than any other book about government management. The successful practices in his book have been used throughout the world in helping local, state, and national governments rethink their roles in modern society and their means of providing governmental services.

There are 91,000 local governments in the USA and 4,494 local governments in California. They all have elected officials and the power to tax. Some have seasoned professional management. Some have leading edge entrepreneurial managers. They could use your help and support. Ted will be exploring questions like "WHAT IS GOOD GOVERNMENT?" and "HOW WILL WE KNOW ONE WHEN WE SEE GOOD GOVERNMENT?". You will be shocked and proud to learn about how good governments can be managed.

Ted has a long history in government management. He started his government career in Vandalia, Ohio in 1972 as City Manager. He moved on to the City Manager position in Visalia, California and in 1985 was appointed to the City Manager role in San Rafael, California. In Nevada County, California he served as CEO and was the first appointed City Manager of Rancho Cordova where he served for 11 years. He led the new City of Rancho Cordova to become an All-America City in 2010, and to be selected in Fortune magazine's Great Places to Work list (the first city government to ever make the list).

Mr. Gaebler graduated from Miami University in Ohio before earning his Master's Degree in Government Administration from the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton Graduate School of Business (Fels Institute of Government).

He and his wife, Bonne, reside at Villa Marin in San Rafael.

Children 6-12 are \$15 and under 6 are \$5



July 29, 2024 SIR State Board and Executives

Gentlemen,

The Executive Committee of Branch 47 has reviewed and discussed the proposed initiatives that were presented during the Zoom meeting of 6/26/24. Our Big and Little Sirs were present for the Zoom meeting, and we are very concerned that many initiatives such as the name change seem to be moving forward without additional input and agreement from the many branches and members throughout the state. These initiatives if implemented would change the core of SIRs as we know it and result in the immediate loss of many of our current members. We are a retired men's social group who want nothing more than new friends, fun, fellowship, and activities such as our luncheons, Bocce Ball, and golf outings. Our new members come primarily through word of mouth, although some marketing to let the community know we exist is ok. We want minimal rules and easy management simply to administer the activities that our branch enjoys while keeping costs and management time as low as possible.

Branch 84 and 110 forwarded us a letter that lists the initiatives being considered as follows (We have added our comments):

1. Changing the Mission Statement and Logo – Our mission statement is simple and complete. "The Mission of SIR is to enrich the lives of our members through fun activities and events – while making friends for life".

2. Changing the name of the Organization – SIRs has name recognition from our organization since 1958 which would be lost with a name change

3. Relabeling Branches as "Chapters" - This change would require a revision of existing information so the work and cost required would need to be justified.

4. Eliminating the word "Retirement"- We already eliminated the word retirement when we changed the logo to "Social activities for men"

5. Changing the names of the Big and Little Sir to President and Vice-President – This change would require revision of existing information so the work and cost required would need to be justified.

6. Changing the By-Laws to include gender neutrality. – This change was considered in the past couple of years and soundly defeated

7. Reorganizing as a non-profit under the provisions of Internal Revenue Code

§501(c)(3).- A 501(c)(3) is defined as a nonprofit charitable organization that can have a very specific list of purposes. Our only purpose is fun and fellowship which is not the type of organization that fits under the 501(c)(3) umbrella. We do not need the extra charitable service requirements and donation tracking that come with a change to 501(c)(3).

8. Adding paid management in the form of an executive director, a marketing firm, or an information technology firm. - This change would add costs for all members reaping minimal rewards. We should keep management as simple as possible to allow volunteers to complete the needed activities.

These initiatives are being considered to shore up the declining membership with the goal of bringing in younger members even if they are not yet retired and making activities more attractive to working people. We do not agree with this proposed approach. Instead, we agree with the statements made in the letter provided by branches 84 and 110. The members that we have talked to like SIRs as it currently exists, and any change should be slow and by the consensus of branches and members.

If change is needed, the "Summary from ChatGPT" 6 item action list is a good place to start. Any changes should begin with items <u>2. Conduct member surveys, 3. Increase communication, 5. Training programs, and 6. Advertise and recruit</u> before starting any of the pathways to the changes.

PLEASE STOP any implementation of initiatives or changes until each branch has an opportunity to vote on each of the initiatives proposed. Implementation without agreement will result in significant loss of membership. Sincerely,




