Dr. George Gallagher: From hay hooks and pitchforks to Precision Animal Agriculture—Technology in Food Production



Dr. George Gallagher gave an entertaining and informative talk on some of the recent advances in agricultural technology, especially as it relates to the dairy industry. He is the Head of the Animal Sciences Department at Cal Poly University, San Luis Obispo, after a 20-year stint as Dean of Animal Sciences at Berry College in Georgia.

Cal Poly is an important agricultural school that focuses its research on applied science that directly impacts the production of food.

California is the number one dairy state in the country, and at 41 billions pounds, dairy is the most important agricultural product in state.

Dr. Gallagher described how advances in technology have greatly increased the productivity of farms and dairy cows. A fascinating example was the use of giant (up to 72-cow) rotary milking "parlors". Imagine a very slow Merry-go-round that makes a revolution every 10 - 12 minutes. The cows are trained to enter their stalls for feed, a single attendant cleans the cow and attaches a milking machine, and the cow is milked while taking a ride. A single person can effectively milk 72 cows in the time it used to take for a single cow. What was impressive was how smart the cows were in the whole operation!

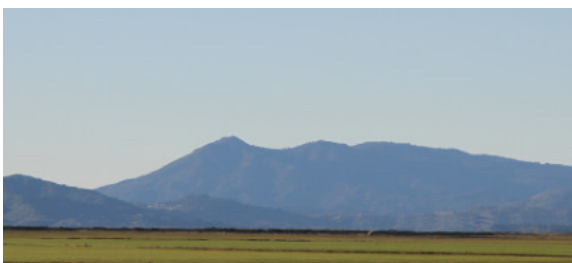

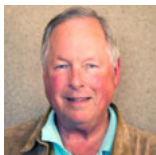

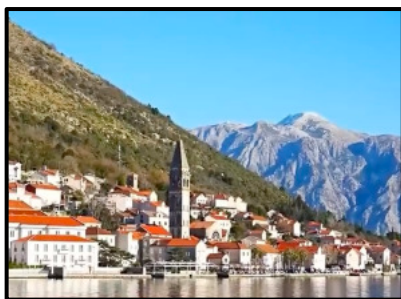
